My Lord,

In reply to Your Lordship's despatch No. 3 of June 18th 1907, I have the honour to report that the small detachment of Police is under the command of the District Officer, and the Troops of Yante, are under the direct supervision of the District Officer. The Native Chiefs are to be allowed to employ themselves in their District.

I have referred the Provincial Council, Jubaland, that until a more permanent arrangement is made for the taking charge of Corbe there is no help for it but to utilize the services of the Native Chiefs, but that the detachment of Police must be solely under the local administration and cannot be allowed to
