My Lord,

In reply to paragraph 6 of Your Lordship's

Circular despatch of March 14th respecting the arrangements now in force for providing security against the loss of money in the custody of public officers, I have the honour to report that the only two cases of defalcation which have occurred during the last ten years have been committed by unimpeached Burasian Clerks.

In the first case Rs.5,861.15.2 were recovered out of a sum of Rs.5,491.8.1, the balance being written off on the authority of the Foreign Office; while in the second Rs.252.15.2 were recovered out of Rs.1,513.0.1, the balance being written off on Your Lordship's authority.

European Officers secured through the Crown Agents with the Law Guarantee and Trust Society.

3. The total amount contributed to the Society by these officers during the last ten years is approximately £1,000, and in no single case has the Society been called upon to make good any loss.

4. No cost has been incurred by the Government in guaranteeing officers.

5. The system of securities in this Protectorate has hitherto been most unsatisfactory; only European officers appointed from home have been secured with the exception of the Post Office Staff, the whole Indian and native staff has been exempt, though as a rule they have charge of both cash and stores. This position was resented by the European Officers.

Moreover the amount (£.200) for which an officer is secured is the same in all cases regardless of the value of the cash and stores in his charge and irrespective of the amount of salary drawn. A copy of the Treasurer's report on this state of affairs was forwarded to the Foreign Office by the late Sir D.

Stewart in his despatch No. 675 of October 26th 1904,
when the question was referred to Your Lordship's
Office, the opinion being expressed that all officials
whether principal or subordinate who had charge of cash
or stores should be secured. I then convened a Board
consisting of the Treasurer, the Crown Advocate and the
Local Auditor to report on the matter. After receipt
of their report which submitted a very comprehensive
list of officers to be secured, a copy of which is
enclosed, and in view of the terms of your Circular
Circular under Pappy, I instructed the Board to submit
a fresh list based, not on the existing Colonial
Regulations, but on the special circumstances of each
individual case. This list, of which I enclose a copy,
omits a large proportion of those included in the previous
list, on the grounds that the checks referred to in
Your Lordship's Circular are sufficient and the amounts
which could be embezzled are out of all proportion to
the risks of detection and the penalties which detection
would entail.

In view of these considerations I venture to

recommend

recommend the adoption of this alternative list for

Your Lordship's favourable consideration.

2. With regard to the form of security I would

suggest the acceptance of personal bonds with one or
two securities, or of Bank Deposit notes.
