- (1) J. H. Hubbard Stuart - age 24. He  
the son of a Presbyterian Minister at  
Knoxton and was educated at Glasgow  
Academy. He has several years  
clerical experience of which the last  
five have been with the Glasgow  
and Western Company - who speak  
highly of him. His referees' replies  
are satisfactory and he has made a  
good personal impression. He is a  
member of the London Scottish Students.
- (2) H. Barrowes - age 21. Edinburgh  
Academy. Banking experience for the  
last four years. His present employers  
and his referees speak well of him.  
He made a moderate but adequate  
impression when he called.

Either of these candidates would be
