apparently no authenticated copies have been sent home. To deal with the rest under these circumstances would simply be necessary & Africa in a stock of copies was. There is no reason for either mission or the instructions which have been in force since 1902 previous to the full report by the Commissioner (throughout the Protectorate) and the transmission of authenticated copies. See paras 8 & 25.

Instructions from the funds are, and remain on the same basis. The instructions have been 1870-1902 and have 2 authenticated copies of each of the copies of the instructions sent to Africa. It is necessary to have been previously instructed as to copies of the instructions sent home.

[I]nasmuch as it is clear considering the similarity of the instructions to those of the other parts in Africa. It is proposed to amend the instructions of 1902 and to propose to amend and re-issue the 1902 instructions so as to contain the same as those of 1902 in Col Reg 1902 provisions for a report by the local officer who drafted the instructions to the Governor, in cases providing for the submission of copies in case of consultations, also similar letters or acquiescence copies in case of adaptations of the regulations, and a clear broad copies as you may think expedient. A part of Col Reg 261-12 providing for 2 copies of plain copies for Co and plain copies for all or some of the institutions mentioned in Col Reg 261 and also the security of stamp papers.
