that we would make inquiries as to the financial standing

limited, of 22 Fenchurch Street E.C.

2. In reply I her to say that we have obtained
the following confidential information respecting the
Company. Their nominal capital is £500,000 of which
150,000 is paid up. The General Rubber Company of New York
