Emoluments.

Sir,

In continuation of my application in 1905 and my letter dated the 5th February 1906 acknowledged by your letter No. 22/1906, of the 10th August 1906, I again most respectfully claim may be pleased to sanction a revision in my emoluments.

My first agreement expired on the 5th January 1902, during which time my promotion should have had effect although my voluntary for the continuance of His Majesty's Government service for 310 days more had been provided for by that agreement was the cause of the first increase to my pay being withheld until the 1st September 1902.

3. It is the 10th January 1902 from which the last increase in my emoluments rightly dates and the work under my control has in the meanwhile increased not less than 150% - that is to say it is fully two and a half times as great now as it was in 1902. - The cost of living in Bombay has unquestionably increased very much since I arrived and I have recently received notice from my landlord of his intention to raise the Rent of my residence from the 1st October next. - He who is unwilling to accept an increase of about 10% more than offered. - My servants I am paying about 25% more than I first came to Bombay and many necessaries of life have increased in still greater ratios.

4. The Indian Government themselves the altered

position

position of the European in India to-day and has already improved the status of officers in many of its Departments such as the Police, the Forest, and others. In view also of the more exacting position of those compelled to reside in Presidency towns they are granted special allowances under various heads amounting in some instances to a very considerable increase to their pay regarding which reference is invited to my confidential letter dated the 15th February 1907,-

S. I would be permitted to address for his Lordship's consideration also the fact that the emoluments I was receiving in Calcutta ten years ago were approximately one half more than those I am receiving now.
