
Sir,

In reply to Mr. Astrobhai's letter of the 2nd ultm. (45394/1706), respecting the grant of a gratuity on retirement to Shulax Mehta, an Indian Deputy Inspector in the Police Force of the East Africa Protectorate, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that, as this officer's service in the Police Force only amounts to 7½ years, My Lords are unable, as in the case of Aaron Itta, an Indian carpenter in the employment of the British Central Africa Protectorate, which formed the subject of the letter from this Department of the 21st October 1905, to regard him as qualified for any award under the Regulations referred to.
