Sir,

In reply to Mr. ~~Arbous~~'s letter (7508/1907) of the 6th instant, I am to request you to inform the Earl of Elgin that, with the modifications suggested by His Lords, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury approve the scales proposed for the supply of furniture to officers in the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates.

Their Lordships assume that the supply in Uganda will be subject to the rule suggested by Mr. Rose for East Africa, that on a change or discontinuance of occupancy the furniture will be examined and the outgoing officer held responsible for loss and for damage otherwise than by fair wear and tear.
