In reply to Mr. Antrebus' letter of the 27th ultimo, I am to request you to inform the Lord of Elgin that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury sanction the temporary employment, for one year, of an expert to assist the local authorities of the East Africa Protectorate in the revision of the Mining Laws.

This officer may receive salary - to be met from savings - at the rate of £500 per annum while serving in Africa, with half pay on the voyages from and to this country and without title to leave on the expiration of his engagement.
