I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr Antrobus's letter of the 14th instant (16530/1907), with regard to the abolition of the legal status of slavery in the mainland dominions of the Sultan of Zanzibar which form part of the East Africa Protectorate.

The Earl of Elgin proposes that a special Commissioner should be appointed to proceed to East Africa to enquire into and report on the question of the expense involved in this measure.

His Lordship further degires that the abolition of the legal status of slavery should not be deferred until the report of the Commissioner is received but that effect should be given to it as doon as possible after his arrival in the Protestainte.
