TREASURY CHAMBERS

Sir,

In view of the further information given by Mr. Autobus' letters (11073 and 19115) of the 13th ultimo and 3rd instant with reference to the status of officers in the proposed Department of Native Affairs in the East Africa Protectorate, and more particularly of the fact that no difficulty is expected to occur concerning the absorption of the officers were the Department to be discontinued, I am to request you to inform the Earl of Elgin that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury agree that the Secretary for Native Affairs and his Assistants may be pensionable.

The Assistants will then receive the same salary as and be interchangeable with Assistant District Commissioners.

My Lords understand that Mr. Hollis, the Secretary to the Administration, has been specially selected by the Commissioner to organize the Department as its Secretary.

If the Secretary of State approves this recommendation, My Lords will not object to the assignment to Mr. Hollis of a salary of £700 per annum in the new post. But They would ask the Secretary of State to consider whether the Secretary in the Native Affairs Department should not normally be graded with and receive the same salary as the Provincial Commissioners and District Commissioners.

Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for a proprietary appointment as Assistant in the Dept for Native Affairs in the C.A.R. with salary at the rate of £250 p.a. and five quarters or an allowance in lieu thereof.

A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate is enclosed herewith, and you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by us with the sanction of the Secretary of State. A copy of the regulations as to pensions is also enclosed.

If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department, whose names are given on the annexed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be signed and left with him, and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea.

The Party will call and his report direct to this Department.
