Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 17th instant (23485/1907), in which the Earl of ~~Clarendon~~ ^{request} that, in view of the extreme difficulty of obtaining a candidate for the post of Commissioner of Works in the East Africa Protectorate, the salary of the post may be raised from £1,000 to £1,200 a year.

In reply I would state that, in all the circumstances, the Lords are prepared to assent to this proposal on the understanding

(1) That the officer salary will be informed that he will have no claim upon the pension in respect of his East Africa service.

(2) That the salary of £1200 will be personal to the new Commissioner and will be reconsidered on the occurrence of a vacancy in the line of the Commissioners of the Protectorate.
