Appendix 2, being notes on the indigenous trees, has been delayed owing to the absence on leave of Mr. Stapf from the Kew Herbarium. This will be submitted later on receipt of the full botanical determinations from Kew; also appendices 1 and 3.

With the Report, I submit a small table collection of woods of British East Africa. This occupies but little space and will, I think be found useful for office reference. Five sets of this small table collection have been prepared and distributed, as mentioned in my report, where they can be of easy access to those who may seek to develop the forests of British East Africa. The photographs accompanying the report will, I trust, make it clear. Should they not be reproduced, I would ask that the originals may be returned to me when no longer required, forest photographs being a particularly difficult subject.
