In reply, the Secretary
noted that although the lot in
question had been established by
the Government, it was
intended to be referred back to the
Treasury Staff.

It will be seen on p. 2 of the letter of
the 1st instant that his Honor
the Customs Minister in Uganda has
recently carried out a fitting of the
Treasury Staff, which is sufficient to deal
with the extra work involved.

There is therefore no staff which can be
utilized at the end of 1907.

The Uganda Staff will have increased
rapidly so in a short time we shall be
faced with the alternative of either
reducing the Treasury Staff considerably
or re-starting the Customs Dept.
