James prints of F.R. correct in 1903 marked with chips. See especially the reports enclosed with Sir C. Eliot's despatches of 22 May/03 [No. 136 in Part LXXIII] and 486 of 19 Oct/03 [No. 170 in Part LXXV], the latter of which was sent in reply to an enquiry from the India Office as to whether the settlers were all ex-Ranby coolies or if not what indentments had been held out.

Mr Waller's report in despatch 486 of 19 x 03 shows that those who were not ex-coolies had come over on the suggestion of their friends, but without Govt. sanction; but he suggests proposed to go to India to get more families I.O. were inf. of this but raised no objection.

There has been nothing further of a general nature except that arrangements were being made to bring over wives & families (Sir C. Eliot 29 18 100). I.O. were inf. of this.

Although this is the first occasion of direct Govt. sanction but under the circumstances I do not think
