What I note in the draft "Instructions"

MR. ROAD:

The instructions I shall receive with regard to the executive and legislative Councils provide for a "Senior Commissioner" and not for a "Deputy Commissioner".

It will therefore be necessary to alter the title of Mr. Jackson's office from that of "Deputy Commissioner" to "Senior Commissioner".

We have discussed the question of the nomenclature of the rest of the Executive Staff, and I think it was agreed to follow the titles generally used in the Colonial Office and alter the present titles as follows:-

- Sub-Commissioners - to be styled - Provincial Commissioners.
- Collectors - District Commissioners.
- Assistant or Sub-Collectors - Assistant District Commissioners.

At present Mr. Kotley - the Senior Sub-Commissioner - is styled "Assistant Deputy Commissioner". I see no object in differentiating his appointment from that of the other Sub-Commissioners, by creating such a title as "Assistant Senior Commissioner" and I think it will be sufficient if he takes his place at the head of the "Provincial Commissioners".

These powers, if approved, will have to be published in the local Gazette, and a Notification will have to be issued conferring the necessary powers at present exercised by Sub-Commissioners, Collectors and Assistant Collectors - on the newly named officials.
