With reference to your 24569/1907 enclosing copy of a telegram from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, I beg to say that I quite agree as to the advantage of having the walls of the Indian Bazaar and the tank cut and draining the site, as speediest as possible. It is also very important that the site of the permanent offices, the rail and police lines should be drained.

I think the courses recommended by the Committee could be quite well effected providing the main drainage of the town proper is gone on next year.

There is an advantage in the fact that the work suggested is being carried from an advantageous point of view, viz. the reconstruction of the main sewer, and it will possibly be found that the drainage works suggested in a letter written to you with reference to the sewer, may be done at the same time.

I should suggest that a preliminary investigation for this work the Governor should be instructed that detailed plans and estimates will be sent off in about a month's time, and that in
