Referring to your telegram of 15th January, re-
port by post from Kismayu confirms death Captain
Bongiovianni but states Captain Molinari wounded
and prisoner. Lugh held by Signor Segv with re-
mainder of garrison. No apprehension for safety of
Lugh but great apprehension for portion of Bardera
garrison under Lieutenant Cibelli which has gone to
assistance of Lugh. Raiding party by latest reports
composed of Abyssinians and Aulihan Agaden. Above
information just received by Salkeld's letters
which have been posted semi-officially after closing
mail.
