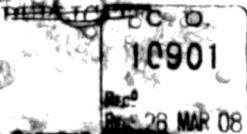

I have the honor to represent the case of Mr. E. G. to the favorable consideration of His Excellency.

Mr. E. G. is serving on a three years appointment which expires in April 1908, and is entitled to six months leave during that time.

He completed 22 years service in the Survey Department, Cochin Survey Section, in November, 1907. His character on leaving the duty was excellent and he holds the medal for Good Conduct and long service. He has had considerable experience as a Surveyor in all parts of the British Isles, besides having served and surveyed in China, West Africa, South Africa during the war and in this country on the Anglo-Cochin Boundary Expedition.
