districts against the Etiabhi tribe living between Karrari
and Mervielou and the Wobi people had been driven
out on the usual called a council or war. Captain
Karrari the resident at Gwadu was now chief of the
one of the two Italian officers near had the senior
Military Officer attended.

He informs me that the hand of the government
is not forced they will attack the Riffmaal in August
with 2000 rifles and some artillery in addition to
garrisons on stations.

This force will leave the coast at four points
at or near Mogodiseo and Verka and operate on the
rivers. The idea appears to be afterwards occupy
positions along the river to the Wei Shabalyi about where it
turns inland and south of Mogodiseo to cover the
country from incursions of hostile natives especially
of the Amazarius of the Nullah.

Apparently these operations will be confined to driving the Pioneers across the Rishi Shehalyi and occupying that line. So far as I know no arrangements have been made to stop the enemy when defeated from striking on the Tashkent.

In view of the above considerations I have to say
that I pay it necessary I can be allowed to extend
my stay at Singapore for a few days further.

The Italian authorities after fighting in various places against the Kimpala tribe living between Verka and Mogodiseo and the Wehi Shihalyi and bombarding places on the coast called a council of war. Captain Verkari the resident at Mombasa now informs me death of the two Italian Officers near Hugh the senior Military Officer attended.

He informs me that the hand of the Government is not forced they will attack the Rizmaal in August with 2000 rifles and some artillery in addition to garrisons on stations.

This force will leave the coast at four points at or near Mogodiseo and Verka and operate on the river. His idea appears to be afterwards occupy a line from the sea to the Wehi Shihalyi about were it turns inland and north of Mogodiseo to cover the country from incursions of hostile natives especially of the Amisarius of the Mullah.

Apparently these operations will be confined to driving the Rizmaal across the Wehi Shihalyi and occupying that island. So far as I know no arrangements have been made to allow the enemy whom defeated from driving off the island.

In view of the above possibility I have to ask that I may if necessary later on be allowed to expend my available intelligence resources and further services.

It may be worth noting that in the late fighting the Somali riflemen made use of intrenchments.

and Mogodisole and the Wabi Shebelyi are bombarding
the town of the same called a council of war. Captain
instructed the Resident at Gubbi for now to inform
one of the two Italian officers commanding the Italian
Military Officer attended.

He informed us that the hand of the Government
had forced them to attack the Bismal in August
with 2000 rifles and some artillery in addition to
garrisons at stations.

This force will leave the coast at four points
at or near Mogodisole and Merka and operate on the
river. The idea appears to be afterwards occupying
a line from the sea to the Wabi Shebelyi about where it
turns inland and forth of Mogodisole to cover the
country from incursions of hostile natives especially
of the Emisaries of the Mullah.

Apparently these operations will be confined to
driving the Bismal across the Wabi Shebelyi and
then occupying that line. So far as I know no arrangements
have been made to stop the enemy when defeated
from arriving on the Tuba.

In view of the above possibility I have to ask
that you if necessary later on be allowed to demand
Rs. 2000/- compensation without notice or further
referendum.

the Somali tribesmen made use of antipersonnel
