2. As regards Mr. Horne's horse, the Veterinary Officer who has since returned to England reported that it was dying of tsetse fly disease, a diagnosis afterwards confirmed by an examination of blood slides. Mr. Horne paid Rs. 600 (P. 33.6.8) for his horse.
