In Memorandum of the 18th December 1903
No. 4 dated 11th July 1904 it is laid down that after
years' approved service on the Railway Commissioners of
our Steamers can be admitted to the pensionable service
with effect from the date of joining the Railway.

2. Captain W. W. J. Townsend completed his 5
years' service on the 17th June next and consequently,
on that date, will be eligible to come under the above
rule.

I would refer you to my letter No. 225 dated
the 13th November 1904 and to the official report on
Captain Townsend which accompanied it by letter No. 231 of
the 18th December 1904. The high opinion I then expressed
of Captain Townsend has been more than justified by
his subsequent services.

I have the honor, therefore, to strongly re-
commend that Captain Townsend be placed on the pension-
able establishment on the same conditions as now.

mentioned in the 5th Colonial Office despatch
(confidential) dated 17th July 1907 for the
Colonial Office, No. 11, was:

- (1). The refund of the 65 on salaries paid in the
list of Appropriation Fund since he joined
the service and the resolution of the Board of
Commissioners for the Straits; and
- (2). A waiver of any minor privileges as to
leave etc. including the allowance of £7.10s
for miscellaneous travelling expenses, at
present enjoyed by the Railway staff but not
by most other Officers in general.

5. Captain Richmond has been paid as follows:-

Appointed on 17-6-05 on	£ 560
Promoted " 7-8-05 to "	300
" " 16-7-05 " "	560
" " 16-7-06 " "	590
" " 16-7-07 " "	640

and he is entitled to promotion to £650/- from 16-7-08.

Following the precedent set in the case of
the late Captain Farnall, viz by confidential letter
No. 50/17 L.S. dated the 10th May 1907 and Colonial Of-
fice confidential despatch dated the 17th July 1907, I
have recommended that in the event of Captain Richmond
being appointed to permanent service he shall not
receive his increment in July next but his salary shall
remain at £640 until 10th July 1908 and he shall be
entitled to a 5% annual increase of £10/-
