TELEGRAM. The Governor of the East African Protectorate to the
Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 2.45 P.M. 23 May 1908.)

No. 84. Patterson informs me that Blyth died on
morning of 21st March at Daresala 35 miles from
Marsabit (where he) accidentally shot himself in
the head with a revolver. Death immediate. He had
been ill for two days. Mr. Blyth Patterson had been
with him all night accident (ally) occurred early in
the morning whilst temporarily alone. Patterson
returned very ill. Statements will be sent by post.
Hopwood with us Mrs. Blyth comes to-day both leave
for England on "Hersog".
