Section 2. Enactment of East Africa Savings Bank.	<p>Uganda Treasury Savings Bank Ordinance 1908. Section 1. "Post Master General" for "Treasurer". Provision is further made in the East Africa Ordinance for the objects of a branch of the Savings Bank. A necessary provision as it may be found necessary to do so. A post office from the laws of the territory.</p>

The provisions of section 20 of the Uganda Ordinance with regard to the bequest on the death of a Depositor who is a native of the Protectorate have not been inserted in East Africa Ordinance as in this Protectorate there exists no reasons for taking the funds belonging to natives out of the provisions of sections 20 and 21.

Sections 21 and 22 of the Uganda Ordinance with regard to distributing the funds of a depositor being illegitimate and crime intentator the funds of a depositor dying intestate and leaving no illegitimate relations have not been inserted in the East Africa Ordinance. As regards the European population the condition of things which made the insertion of such provision in the English Act advisable is nonexistent in this Protectorate. As for the natives of the country are concerned it may be taken that they would infinitely prefer that their estates should be distributed according to their own laws and customs.
