I have the honor to refer to Your Lordship's despatch No. 337 of the 2nd July last. Nothing is known here regarding the matter referred to in the first portion of Sir George S. G. Robertson's question. Neither the Department of Native Affairs nor the Public Works Department, who would presumably have used the Labour, have any knowledge of natives being commandeered, on their way to do voluntary work, for employment on the roads.

2. As regards the second matter referred to, Government Officials do not send armed policemen at night into villages to drive and force natives to carry loads, such a procedure could not be tolerated for a moment. The Provincial Commissioners are all assembled at present in Nairobi to discuss their budgets and other provincial matters, and they can make of them ~~more~~ any instance of this kind having occurred.

3. I may further be allowed to point out, with reference to the answer given in the third part of the question, that in accordance with the desire
