My Lord,

With reference to paragraph 4 of Your Lordship's despatch No. 353 of the 31st of July last I have the honour to transmit herewith two authenticated and one printed copies of an Ordinance to make provision for a Provident Fund for the non-pensionable servants of State Railways; to which I have assented in the name of His Majesty.

2. The reasons for the enactment of this Ordinance were explained at length in the Memorandum by Mr. Currie which accompanied my despatch No. 444 of the 15th of October 1907 and a further explanatory memorandum by

Despatch No. 7464 March 1935MEMORANDUM

This Ordinance is to make provision for a provident fund for the non-pensionable servants of the Railway. Certain rules were sent to the G.O. for a royal. But before the rules could be adopted, an Ordinance had to be passed to enable rules to be made. The Bill is taken from certain Indian Acts and is (which are more fully explained in the Schedule) one of these do not apply to this Protectorate. The generally approved of the draft rules from which this Ordinance has been drafted and care will be taken in making the rules under the Ordinance that the alterations suggested by the G.O. will be complied with. Mr. Guggis has explained very fully in his memorandum which accompanied Your Excellency's despatch C.C. No. 444 the reason for this legislation.

(2). There are identical with similar sections in the

instead of Rs. 1,000 on our Ordinance.

This is adopted from the Indian rules that is regulated  
by the Indian Succession Act (X of 1865) and the  
Administrator General's Act (II of 1871) and the  
Succession Certificate Act (VII of 1882). Certain  
of these Acts are not applied to the Protectorate.
