1. I have the honour to report that I have recently
been requested by the King of the Saudi family, Rasheed
bin Fahd, to give his views of law relating on the question of
compensation for slaves.

2. It appears that Rasheed bin Fahd is said to have
owned 200 slaves, and he has submitted a list of 779
slaves whose value is given as Rs.4,000 and Rs.80,000, who
he claims belonged to him two or three years ago. Many
of these slaves have since run away, and although he has
been considerably by the promulgation of the Abolition of
the Slave Trade or Slavery Ordinance 1907, he would
probably consider it difficult in proving some
of his claims in a court of law. Notwithstanding this
he would most likely be awarded half the amount claimed;
but, like most of the Arabs, Rasheed bin Fahd has a great
objection to訴ing before a magistrate with his
slaves and being possibly submitted to cross-examination
in their presence. He has therefore suggested a compromise
and has intimated his willingness to accept a lump sum
of Rs.80,000 on renouncing all his claims. As this will
