Sale of liquor in E. Africa.

In East Africa the sale of liquor to natives is prohibited. In W. Africa it is only prohibited in the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and Northern Nigeria.

This is in accordance with articles XC - XCII of the Protocol of 1890, by which the Powers having possessions in Africa between 20° N. lat.
