Having regard to this balance, My Lords do not think it necessary that a grant in aid should be included in the Colonial Bervices Estimate to the full extent margasted by the Karr of Kiggs The accuratistion of balances memessits es expenditure outside the Betimetes, which, in Their Lordships optation, le mai destreble as a permanent arrangement, and it was only resorted to last year in the exceptional circumstances of the account (Treasury letter 4768 of 27th March 1907). For the ensuing year. My Lords would prefer that the Protectorate an beharger bac clody a as bitters at bluede coongled arailable for any sanctioned expenditure, instead of being described as "special funds" earmarked to particular items; and similarly that all expenditure in the year whether 'special' or recurrent, should be impluded in the Estimate for the year.

On those lines My Lords think that a grant in aid of £138,000 should suffice for the year 1908/9 and They sanction provision being made accordingly.
