Received Colonial Office 9.50 a.m. 13th November, 1905.

No.216. Following received from Smith. Demarcation effected Iaitakitch to Iatema as in despatch of 15th July
No.369. Iatema to Rufu River demarcated on the basis of existing native rights which gives Germans, seven square miles. I asked for Mohuru Point and centre line of Rufu River and half Jipe Lake in exchange. Captain Scholoback has given no formal answer yet but concessionally has asked for Kajera Mouth and other concessions to the west of lake and access for Chagga people to Useni and Kimanefia Rivers. Consider question best discussed in Europe on arrival of maps. Hope no further work will be required in the field. Protocols of course reserve final decision to governments.
