The larger question to
which the Treasury refers is the
question of affording a British
officer tract as Inspector of
the Frontier under Sir J.
Harrington. This is mystery
(see telegram from Sir J. H. 26th
14257) until the frontier
is delineated. For the mean-
time the ~~at~~ provision of an
additional escort for Mr.
Zephias the general

It seems clear, from Dr J Harrington,
that the increased escort is required at
once. Some time, even if the Treasury sanction
the Commission getting under weigh at once (see
minutes on 15/2/55), must necessarily elapse
before they are on the spot. Their labours will
take, with probability, at least a year and
the larger question is to be deferred until the
Woodbury commission has done its work, as
Dr J Harrington considers it better not to

raise it with trepidation before them. Meanwhile the raiding & looting continues, and, if we can trust the reports we receive, the E. A. Protectorate revenues suffer heavily in consequence.

Even allowing that the £3,000 a year which is now lost to the Protectorate (Sir J. Harrington's tel. No. 17, March 28/08) may be too high a figure, I think we should be justified in assuming that the increased escort should at any rate save enough to the Prot^t revenues to meet what ^{it will} ~~they~~ cost - £500 a year - to say nothing of the greater prospects of peace and quiet on the frontier. I would venture to suggest a renewed appeal to the Treasury somewhat on these lines:

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 14th instant (11732/1908), and its enclosures, respecting a proposal to increase the escort of the Travelling Inspector of the Southern Abyssinian boundary at an estimated cost of £500 a year.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Earl of Cradock that My Lords are unwilling to sanction any addition to the escort of the Travelling Inspector until it has been finally decided whether the existing measures for the protection of the frontier should be continued on their present footing; and they would therefore be glad if this proposal could be deferred pending consideration of the larger question.



(b) Sir John Harrington
does not consider it
advisable to approach
the frontier or the
larger question "without
neglecting British officers
as far as they are concerned
boundary until after
the delimitation is
completed, i.e. not
for at least a year; but
that the ultimate
decision of this question
will in no way be
prejudiced by the
possess of an additional
element for the present
Inspector.

(c) At the present time
Sir John Harrington
calculates that at
least £30000 £³⁰⁰⁰⁰
is lost of the revenue

of the S.A.P. by the
locking of every
pon our treasury
by the Abysinians,
& consequent loss of
the duty payable
to the Govt. on its ex-
ports. It was
probable that the
additional cost
will enable the Prospector
to receive at least
£500 of this loss.
