In reply to Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 27th April last I am to say, for the information of Secretary the Earl of Greve, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury agree subject to the reservation made below that Mr. Edmondson, Veterinary Officer, and Captain Neave, Live Stock Inspector, in the East Africa Protectorate may, if willing to continue service in the Protectorate, be permanently appointed and receive pension rights as from the date of their original engagements.

I am, however, to point out that My Lords have not assented to the scale of £400 - 20 - £500 (now provided in the Estimates) for Veterinary Officers as a pensionable salary: and They must ask that Mr. Edmondson, on being made pensionable, shall be placed on a salary of £400 per annum, fixed, the amount sanctioned for permanent Veterinary Assistants by Treasury letter (13428/05) of 20th July 1905. Such a reduction of emolument will accord with the principle laid down in paragraph 11 of Mr. Antrobus's letter (2928) of 24th February 1906.
