I have read before the Hon^{ble} Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 4th instant (19545/1908) relative to the gratuity to be granted to Mr. E.F. Webster in respect of his service as Assistant Collector in the East Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Hon^{ble} of Greve that Mr. Webster does not appear to Their Lordships to be entitled to any addition to his pensionable service under the Superannuation Act 1876 in respect of his sick-leave from February 2nd to June 1st which was spent out of the Protectorate.

They can accordingly only sanction the grant to him from Protectorate Funds of a gratuity of £132.18.4, calculated upon a service of 5½ years.
