Sir,

I am directed by the Earl of Crewe to inform you that subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for temporary employment as a medical officer, in the East Africa Protectorate with pay at the rate of £400 a year.

2. Your appointment would be for three years from the date of your arrival at Mombasa. Free first class passage would be provided, and you would receive half salary during the voyage to Mombasa, and full salary from the date of your arrival. Free quarters or an allowance in lieu thereof would be provided.

3. The duties of the appointment would be to attend attaching to the ordinary medical appointments in the Protectorate, but you would be liable to be called upon for duty in connection with the measures which are being taken to arrest the spread of sleeping sickness among the natives of the country. You would, like the permanent medical officers, be under the orders of the Governor and the superintendents of the Medical Department.
