Sir,

I am directed by the Earl of Greve to inform you that subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for temporary employment as a medical officer in the East Africa Protectorate with pay at the rate of £400 a year.

1. Your appointment would be for three years from the date of your arrival at Bombay. Free first class passages would be provided, and you would receive half salary during the voyage to Bombay, and full salary from the date of your arrival. Free quarters or an allowance in lieu would be provided.

2. The duties of the appointment would be those attaching to the ordinary medical appointments in the Protectorate, but you would be liable to be called upon for duty in connection with the measures which are being taken to arrest the spread of sleeping sickness among the natives of the country. You would, like the permanent medical officers, be under the orders of the Governor and the superior-officers of the Medical Department.

4. If you are prepared to accept this offer, I am to request you to present yourself without delay for Medical examination to one of the medical advisers to this Department whose names are given on the enclosed letter. The letter should be left with the Medical Adviser who will send his report direct to this Department. You will be required to pay his professional fee of one guinea.

5. You should inform me whether you are prepared to accept this offer, and, if so, at what date you would be able to proceed to the Protectorate. A steamer will leave Marseilles on the 18th of August next, and it is very desirable that you should proceed by it if you can possibly do so.

6. You should at the same time furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends may be sent during your absence from this country.

I am directed by the Earl of Grenville to inform you that subject to your being passed as fit for service, he proposes to select you for temporary employment as a medical officer in the East African Protectorate with pay at the rate of £400 a year. Your appointment would be for three years from the date of your arrival at Kampasa. Free fares to and from Kampasa would be provided, and you would receive half salary during the voyage to Kampasa, and full salary from the date of your arrival. The duration of an allowance in lieu of wages would be three months. The terms of the appointment would be those attaching to the ordinary medical appointments in the Protectorate, but you would be liable to be called upon for duty in connection with the measures which are being taken to arrest the spread of malarial sickness among the natives of the country. The duties like the permanent medical officers, and under the orders of the Governor and the superior officers of the Medical Department.

I am directed by the Earl of Howe to inform you that subject to your being passed as fit for service, he proposes to send you for employment as a medical officer in the West India Regiments with pay at the rate of £2000 a year. Your appointment would be for three years from the date of your arrival at home. Free passage to and from the West Indies and the necessary expenses would be provided, and you would receive half salary during the voyage to Barbados, and full salary from the date of your arrival at Barbados, or an allowance in lieu thereof to be provided.
