

Suggested programme for the Delimitation Commission.

The following programme is submitted for approval. It has been made the basis for estimating transport and other requirements, but would of dourse be subject to modification either under the instructions of Sir J.

Harrington or in face of unforseen diroumstances.

The dommission to leave England about the end of May and to proceed wim Aden and Jibuti to Addis Marrar. Camels to be collected at Addis Marrar about the end of June.

Major Owynn with a small party to proceed to Addis Abbaba to receive instructions from Sir J. Parrington and to pick up the Abyssinian representatives.

The main caravan to proceed by easy marches via the Havash valley to the Arussi Cella country avoiding the higher plateau.

Major Gwynn with Abyasinians to join the main carsvan I say at Sheikh Mahomed I about the end of August. The expedition to then proceed win the Ganale walley to the Ganale - Dava junction where the work of actual delimitation would commence probably about the end of September.

It is not anticipated however that there are many natural features to be fixed in this country which seems to resemble many of the Soudan plains where nothing could be done in way of survey beyond rough route sketches the terminal points of which were fixed and the intermediate differes determined by timing marches.

Prom the North end of Lake Rudolf, which might be reached early in January, it is proposed to extend Captain Maud's survey Northwest and to thoroughly survey this Southwest corner of the Abyssinian plateau, fixing the position of the escarp which must bound it in this region. It is anticipated that considerable modifications f in favour of abyssinia) will have to be made here in the frontier as defined by treaty.

It is noted that from the 5th parallel morthward to the akobo the frontier is that between the Soudan and Abyssinia. As however it has never been demarquised it is suggested that the commission be given suthority by the angle-Egyptian government to carry out the work if possible.

Having jained up to Major Austin's work on the akobo

inner appears no object in following that river to its, junction with the Pibor as it has been already surveyed and as a frontier mark has been erected at the junction. It is proposed therefore to return from the upper Akobo to adds abbabs either through Eaffs or via Gore surveying and reporting on these little known districts without delaying progress which would entail extra erense.

It is considered that this course is much better than to return via Egypt or British Fast Africa and would result in economy of time and money while affording a considerable amount of new information.

Both Abyssinians and Somalis would know that they were facing directly homewards and no difficulty as regards either transport or su plies would be experienced both being obtainable in the Country.

There would be the furthur advantage that any question which had arisen in the course of the delimitation could be discussed and settled with the Emperor Menelek personally.

It is anticipated that addis Abbaba should be reached before the beginning of the rainy season.
