The Memorial consists
of tanks (protected from
contamination by a
building) for the watering
of the cattle of the natives
who come into Kismayu.

I am now anxious

to provide for the upkeep
in perpetuity of the tanks
& the building, so that
they may be always kept
in a proper state of repair.

The Director of Public
Works in the E.A. Pro-
tectorate informs me that
fifty rupees per annum
would be the amount
required for this. The
Capital sum to provide
for this average yearly

Expenditure would be
(I suppose) about £100
to £120.

I should therefore be
glad to know if I may
be allowed to pay over
to the Colonial Office
the Capital sum necessary
to provide the annual
amount of fifty Rupees
required for the upkeep,
and if the Colonial
Office would then arrange
