The P.O. did not deprecate that an acting Officer had any claim to allowance in respect of his acting service when there was no post of the principal's salary available. This would reduce Mr. Muir's time to 2 months (roughly).

Even on the basis of the actual periods of acting service there is no apparent reason why Mr. Muir (3 1/2 mos) should have five times as much as Mr. Mitchell (1 month) - unless they have multiplied the proportion of acting service by the proportion of substantive salaries!


