Please see the enclosed letter from Mr. C. J. G. to Mr. J. G. who was appointed a District Commissioner in Uganda in July 1914. It will be an idea for you to see the 11 years of the first service in addition to the period of his service under the Imperial British East Africa Co. I wish to state that I think that he has strong claims to promotion in regard to the question, but the D. C. will be promoted in any offer an opportunity of going to something in the D.
