 and to state that the Home Trading Company would gladly
 accept some Egyptian conditions as to the safety of the traders
 and as to their obeying all orders of the Government, in
 regard to their relations with the natives.
 The conditions are identical to those proposed by the Home Trading
 when making a similar application to the East African
 Administration to establish their business with the
 Government, and they then further offered a guarantee of £2,000
 for the balance of all employed by them, their inclusion in the
 regulations etc.
 The conditions were accepted by the East African Administration
 and Government, subject to the usual limit to
 the number of the Home Trading of £200.
 Any further enquiry when having respect on account
 from the Home Trading Company, to the application for permission

To take on the Java River etc
The Messrs J. & W. G. Barry & Co. is now in London and is now
to send for the Java River, and to take of the land on
behalf of the Home Trading Company, should it appear
more a permanent supply.
