Of the charts sent by Commr. Whitehouse, only
that of the southern portion of the lake, with the
appropriate detailed plans 5695, appears to concern
us now. The chart of the northern portion was dealt
with in F.O. days, and copies seem to have been sent
to the railway authorities.

The Governor asked for 200 copies of the map of the
southern portion (45089/06) The map has been produced
by the Admiralty, but I suppose we should have to pay

Sir,

I have the honor to forward herewith revised proofs of the Victoria Nyanza maps.

- ✓ 3252 British portion of the Victoria Nyanza.
- ✓ 3665 German portion of the Victoria Nyanza.
- ✓ 3693 Detailed plans of Munyonyo, Bukoba Roadstead
Nansungu Bay, Mizinda Bay, Lubembe Harbour
and Shirati Bay.
- ✓ 3255 Detailed plan of Entebbe Bay.
- ✓ 3256 Detailed plan of Port Florence.

These maps give the results of my work on the Victoria Nyanza up to the date of my resignation. The plans shown on 3693 and the additions to 3255 have been greatly reduced from the scale on which they were surveyed. Any additions to them should be made on the original scale.

These maps form an exhibit in the Map Dept. of the Franco-British Exhibition.

I beg to call attention to the Memorandum dated Berlin, March 27th 1901 in which the British Ambassador promised to communicate to the German Government the result of the survey in British and German waters.

Remarks on the survey methods and the use of the maps will follow shortly.
