My Lord,

I have the honour to solicit a reference to
Lord Elgin's despatch, confidential, of the 3rd of
March last.

2. During the time Mr. Watts has acted as an
official member of the Legislative Council his wide
experience and knowledge of Administration and the
soundness of his views have been of the greatest
assistance, and I have not found that the sittings
of the Council have in any way interfered with the
efficient control of his office as Commissioner of
Public Works.

3. The retirement of Colonel Will, R.A.M.C.
from the service of the Protectorate has created a
vacancy in the list of official members of the Legis-
lative Council in which I entreated Mr. Watts to act,
after the return of Mr. Melliss, pending the permanent
appointment of a Principal Medical Officer.

4. I consider that for several reasons it would be preferable to have the Commissioner of Public Works rather than the Principal Medical Officer, who can always be consulted when necessary, as a member of the Legislative Council. Mr. Watts is anxious to remain on the Council, Dr. Milne has not the same desire, and I am only echoing the opinions of my colleagues when I say that all, official and unofficial, are desirous of retaining Mr. Watts on the Council.

5. I trust that under the circumstances Your Lordship will be able to agree to Mr. Watts being now appointed a regular member of the Council for two years in the place of Col. Will, and if so I would ask that his name may be submitted for His Majesty's approval.
