has approved the scheme and the work is being carried
out.

despatch of the 28th idem, an agreement for two years only is being made with the Company so that the question of revision of rates can be considered at an even earlier date than that suggested.

4. Several subsidiary points have been brought forward in connection with the terms on which the installation is to be placed in official bungalows and it has been ruled that occupants should replace broken or worn out lamps but that other repairs should be undertaken by the Government.

5. I should be glad to know whether this meets with Your Lordship's approval.
