Cont. In Despatch No. 62 of 2/6/1903

Sir,

In accordance with the request contained in the Principal Secretary of State's letter of the 14th May last, I have the honour to report as follows on the state of the Hill country subsequent to the military operations of January and February 1903.

On the termination of the military operations a full company of the M. A. R. was left in the country, these men were employed in patrolling the various locations. By August this force was reduced by half and by September the whole of the force had been withdrawn.

By this time road works were in full swing and before the end of the year large numbers of Hill were employed on these works and thereby carrying back the cattle which had been taken from them during the operations. The District Commissioner, Mr. R. G. Johnston with his Assistant District Commissioners have by constantly visiting the country got into close touch with the people and have been successful in establishing a very peaceful and satisfactory state of affairs.

I have paid two visits to the country within the year and consider the political situation in every way satisfactory. The Administration officers in charge
