With reference to my telegram No. 78 of June 14th in which I stated that Mrs. Baker, the widow of Dr. H.H. Baker, was not in urgent need of funds, I have the honour to report that it now transpires that such is not the case, and that she is in somewhat destitute circumstances.

2. In view of the fact that her husband's last illness was undoubtedly contracted in the execution of his duty in an admittedly unhealthy district and that had he lived to complete his period of service he would have been entitled to a free passage to England, I have the honour to recommend for Your Lordship's most favourable consideration that the cost of Mrs. Baker's passage to England may be met out of Government funds.

3. I may add that the Principal Medical Officer speaks very highly of the late Dr. Baker's work both in the Nairobi Civil Hospital and in the Sleeping Sickness Settlement.
