My Lord,

I have the honour to report that as a consequence of certain representations made by the Acting Manager of the Uganda Railway to the effect that, in view of the unfavourable reports received on the work of Lieutenant A.R.Wearn, R.N.R., one of the Second Officers on the Lake Steamers, he did not consider it advisable to retain his services, I have accepted his resignation.

2. By submitting his resignation Mr. Wearn forfeits the right to a return passage to England to which he would have been entitled had he been given three months' notice under the terms of his Agreement. I understand, however, that he is absolutely dependent on his pay, and as I considered it most undesirable that he should remain in the country after his resignation had taken effect, I have sanctioned the grant to him of a second class passage for himself and his wife.
