With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No.8 of January 8th 1908, I have the honour to report that all the surviving leaders of the Mazrui rebellion have gratefully accepted the terms of the free pardon accorded to them and that, with the exception of Sheikh Mbaruk bin Rashid, they have now settled peacefully in this Protectorate. Sheikh Mbaruk bin Rashid has preferred to remain in Darmes-Salaam, where he has acquired a

considerable amount of property, and the allowance which it was intended to pay him has therefore not been

2. I have recently been petitioned by the children of the deceased rebel Hamis bin Kombo for the rest of their father's properties which were confiscated the time of the rebellion, and I have the longon to transmit berewith a translation of their petition. Although it was decreed in 1896 that, with the exception of Sheikh Mbaruk's estates, all the properties below in to the other rebels should be confiscated, only some of

Hamis bin Kombo's estates were taken possession of by the Government.

- 3. The children of the other rebels were allowed to remain on their fathers' estate. In view of the free pardon which has been agranted to the rebels I recommend that such of the confiscated properties of Hamis bin Kombo be restored to his descendants as are not required or have not been alienated by the Government. These consist of two cocoanut plantations at Mtwapa and an estate at Mzizima. Hamis bin Kombo's house at Mtwapa is now used as the residence of the Mudir of that town, and as it has been considerably improved by the Government, I should not be inclined to return it.
- 4. One part of the estate at Mzizima has been given to the Hindu Community as a crematorium: the remainder and the two plantations at Mtwapa are leased to Indians, and it would be a gracious act on the part of the Government to restore these as soon as the leases expire.
