Sir,

With reference to your Despatch No. 19, Public, dated the 3rd February 1905, regarding the reduction of the establishment maintained by the Professor of Emigration at Karachi for work connected with the emigration and repatriation of coolies recruited for the Uganda Railway, we have the honour to forward a copy of a letter on the subject which has been received from the Government of Bombay. We consider that a further reduction of the establishment is not feasible at present, and support the contention that it is necessary to retain the senior clerks.

2. We invite attention to paragraph 3 of the letter, and would request that arrangements may be made for the payment by the Uganda Railway of the establishment which it is deemed necessary to retain, until such time as its abolition is sanctioned by the Federal Government.

December 1904, a copy of which is enclosed.

2. The Commissioner in Sind reports that in pursuance of the above
orders, the services of the Protector of Emigrants Junior
were dispensed with from 1st April 1905 and that orders have
been issued to dispense with the services of the cashier on Rs. 30, and that of the clerk on Rs. 20,
from 1st May 1905. At regards the question of abolishing the services of the
altogether, the Commissioner is of opinion that the senior clerk on Rs. 50
should be retained for the present. He observes, " Emigration has not ceased
yet, the last batch of 64 coolies having been despatched from Karachi for the
Uganda Railway so late as the 1st March. Further, there are still 145
emigrants to be repatriated and the work of setting up the mines of the
large number of coolies who have died in Africa still continues, involving a
considerable amount of correspondence with the Punjab authorities. The
Commissioner therefore recommends that the services of the senior clerk on
