APPOINTMENTS OF PRINCIPAL REGISTRAR OF DOCUMENTS AND REGISTRAR OF HIGH COURT

Proposes a separate appointment. Suggests giving Captain Ward the title of Principal Registrar with an increase of £50 or more to his present salary. Thinks however Registrar of High Court should continue to draw his present salary of £400 although £100 was originally granted for the Registration of Documents

Provision is made in the Estimate for the following three offices

- (1) Registrar of High Court £1000
- Principal Registrar of Documents
- (2) Deputy allowance for Registrar of High Court £60
- (3) Deputy Registrar of High Court £750 by £1200

My Lord,

I have the honour to report that it is proposed to separate the appointments of Principal Registrar of Documents and Registrar of the High Court, which have hitherto been held by the same officer.

2. In the opinion of the Judges, with which I concur, there is quite sufficient work in connection with the Court to occupy the whole attention of the Registrar without calling upon him to supervise the Registration of Documents, which lies outside the scope of the ordinary duties of the appointment he holds.

3. I propose giving Captain Ward, at present Deputy Registrar of Documents, the title of Principal Registrar with an increase of £50 per annum in his present salary. He is thoroughly competent and has been in practical charge of the documentary branch of the Registrar's Department for some time.

4. The Registrar of the High Court should in

my opinion continue to draw his present salary of £400 per annum, although £100 per annum of that salary was originally granted for the Registration of Documents. His duties are onerous and responsible and will tend to increase with the establishment of the new Court of Appeal. It would moreover be scarcely equitable to reduce the salary which he is at present drawing.
