position of the administration of the frontier
in the neighbourhood of the Abyssinian and

opinion for a lead on the subject. But I
think we might have expected a reasonably
despatch, stating just what he proposes,
what his proposals will cost, and where
the money is to come from. The S. of B.
can hardly come to a decision on this
telegram. Even if he were willing to do
so, it would not satisfy the Treasury.

he has done admirable service there,
out of all proportion to the meagre £900

I should be inclined to reply
by telegraph that the S.C.B. will be
asked to give careful consideration to
any proposals which the Government submit
by despatch, & that it is necessary that
any such proposal should be explained
in detail, accompanied by an
estimate of cost & an indication of
the manner in which the cost is to be
met, for the purpose of reference to
the Treasury. That it appears from
a despatch from Addis Ababa dated the
2nd October that Mr Zaphiro has
already returned to the frontier.
That the S.C.B. consider that he
should continue his work there until
new arrangements have been approved
& made effective; & that the W.O. will
be asked to extend the period for
which Capt. Cylver has been seconded

So as to permit of his remaining
in East Africa for 3 months from the 20th
Jan next, afterwards send copy of
the telegram & our reply to the F.O. (D)
& ask W.O. as to Capt. Cugler &
that officer's paper.

Paraphrase of a telegram from the Governor of the East Africa
Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the
Colonies,

(Received, Colonial Office, 2.15 p.m., 15th November 1909.)

avin, regard to opinion expressed by Gwynn
in his memorandum enclosed in your confidential des-
patch of August 27th I consider that time has now come
to impose definite and absolute control by officers
of this Protectorate on the Amurian boundary. I
regard this as essential both for administrative reasons
and owing to the growing importance of trade in horses
and cattle I suggest that frontier district should
be formed with stations at Keru, Marsabit and Fort
Harrington. Lapnro should not return to frontier.
It is necessary to support Barrett who has succeeded
him (Allen) & I have to request that the War
(adequately) office may be asked to consent to his re-secondment
of Aylmer one general officer of Fort Harrington for
three months at least - see my telegram No. 182 and
previous correspondence.
